Lend a Hand

Polio Surveillance lab opens in Pakistan

On 11 September, Rotary Foundation Trustee Fumio Tamamura and Pakistani Rotarians celebrated the opening of a key polio surveillance laboratory in Pakistan, one of seven remaining polio-endemic countries.

The Polio Plus Partners program supported a US\$357,075 Rotary Foundation grant for the laboratory at the National Institute of Health in Islamabad. Some of the funding was contributed by District 5240 (California, USA), which raised \$156,728 for the project in 2001-02. The Japanese government also provided high-tech equipment worth \$115,568.

"With the opening of this new facility, the stool samples which had been sent to the CDC [U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention] lab in Atlanta could be examined locally, saving much time and expense," says Tamamura.

- \$40,000 was transferred to the Wabash Valley Community Foundation this month.

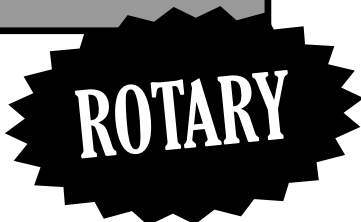
