Read about our own Nicholas Mahurin

In 1998, Nick Mahurin was chairman of the Junior Achievement board of directors. Mike Hopper, the JA Executive Director at the time, introduced Nick to Rotary, and he joined our club in April of that year. "Ralph Cutter was president of the club at that time", Nick recalled.

Most of us know Nick as the owner of CS Technology Center, the company he started in 1989 shortly after graduating from Rose-Hulman. Many people don't know that he practiced engineering and project management at Bemis for two years while finishing his engineering degree. At heart, Nick is an entrepreneur.

While CS continues to provide computer network and database services to local companies (including several members of our club), Nick is currently working on his third information technology startup called InfraWare, a software company in the field of health-care documentation. He loves the challenge involved in bring-

ing a company from the idea stage to the growth stage. InfraWare is Nick's most ambitious project yet, but he has help from seven other local investors including Rose-Hulman Ventures. The company was also fortunate to be selected for assistance by the new Alliance for Innovation at ISU.

Fun fact: In 2005, Nick published a book to address InfraWare's target audience in the medical documentation field called How to Grow Your Transcription Business in the Technology Turbulence Ahead. "It's not a best seller", laughed Nick, "but it has served our purpose".

Nick has one child. His daughter Rachel is an 8th grade cheerleader at Honey Creek Middle School. Due to her petite size, she is the flier at the top of the pyramid. (This is also Nick's biggest worry). He is very involved in Rachel's life and considers fatherhood to be his number one priority. Nick's hobbies include home improve-

ment & sailing. He earned his private pilot's license in 1991 and has a partnership in a Cherokee Six airplane at Hulman Field.

Nick's volunteer and non-profit work started with JA in the mid-nineties when he began as a classroom volunteer for JA Applied Economics. "That was the old JA program in which high school seniors started a company and sold a product to learn how a business worked", recalled Mahurin. He eventually joined the JA board and served in several capacities including chairman. In the years that followed, Nick has participated in numerous service projects with Rotary. In the late nineties, he became involved with the United Way by serving on a fund distribution panel. Today, Nick is serving the first year of a two year term as president of the board for the United Way of the Wabash Valley. "UWWV represents the best of our community", Mahurin smiled, "people helping people care for one another".
