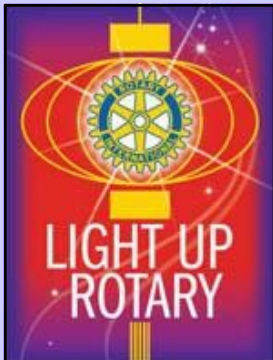

Garrison to Receive Rotary Service Award

A 20-year Rotarian whose volunteer efforts have helped reduce crime, promoted the arts and created a local Walk of Fame will receive our club's Four Avenues of Service Award, according to Vocational Service Chair Jim Tanoos. Neil Garrison will receive the award at our club meeting March 10. The award is presented annually to a member whose professional and volunteer achievements reflect Rotary's Four Avenues of Service.

Neil has repeatedly volunteered for Rotary's dictionary distribution project, Salvation Army bell ringing, and the Max Ehrmann Plaza clean-up. He served two terms on the club's board of directors including five years as our Vocational Chair. Neil has had a successful 30-year career in the advertising and market-

ing field as a marketer, designer/writer, and most recently social media director. He is marketing director for Johns Dental Laboratories, a local business that provides services to dentists nationally and internationally.

Neil was the developer of the Terre Haute Walk of Fame honoring former residents who have made his-

toric contributions to Terre Haute and/or the nation. He created the first electronic Neighborhood Watch program that encourages sharing of criminal trends in the community while keeping participants safe. Neil has supported and raised funds to help alleviate a variety of animal welfare issues through low cost spay & neuter programs. His community leadership includes serving a second term as a city councilman.
